David A. Sklansky teaches and writes about criminal law, criminal procedure, and evidence at Stanford Law School, where he co-directs the Stanford Criminal Justice Center. He is the author of *Criminal Justice in Divided Times: Police, Punishment, and the Future of Democracy*, forthcoming from Harvard University Press. Before joining the faculty of Stanford Law School in 2014, Sklansky taught at the University of California, Berkeley, and at UCLA. Earlier he practiced labor law in Washington D.C. and served as a federal prosecutor in Los Angeles.
